

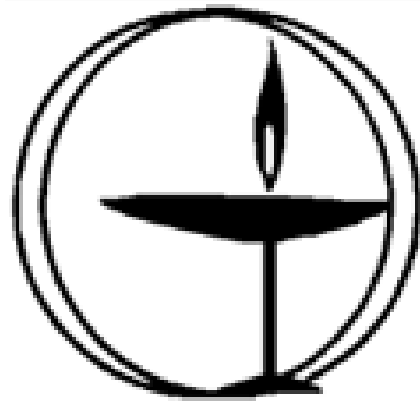

January 3 - ***Power in the Blood: Exploring the Human Interest in Blood Offerings*** - Wes Davis

Wes Davis is an educator, musician, writer and speaker with a broad range of interests and life experiences. He earned his Master of Divinity degree from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. and served as a United Methodist pastor for thirteen years.
