

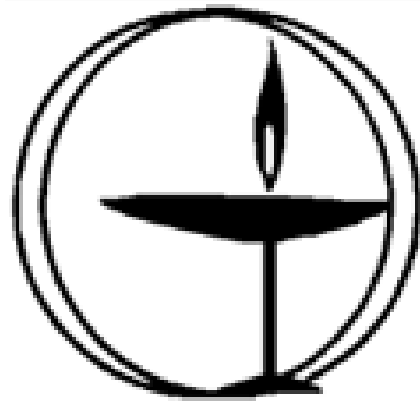

February 7 – **Forbidden Fruit: The Audacity of Moral Freedom and Responsibility** Wes Davis

Wes Davis is an educator, musician, writer and speaker with a broad range of interests and life experiences. He earned his Master of Divinity degree from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. and served as a United Methodist pastor for thirteen years. Currently he is a full-time musician performing mostly in the Ocean City, Maryland area and an adjunct faculty member at Salisbury University in the Communication Arts Department.

February 14 – **Standing on the Side of Love** John Wright

February 14 is, of course, Valentine's Day and the Unitarian Universalist Association has also designated it "National Standing on the Side of Love Day". Many Unitarian Universalist congregations begin each service with the statement that "Love is the doctrine of this church". In this service John Wright will consider Valentines' Day, the various forms our doctrine of love can take, and the idea that we are standing, not only on the side of love, but in the midst of it, as well.
